

# Dodger Stadium Transportation Study



## Project Background

Dodger Stadium hosts numerous baseball games and events each year, drawing tens of thousands of attendees at a time. Today, most visitors arrive by car, contributing to traffic and access challenges in the surrounding neighborhoods.

In 2024, Councilmember Eunisses Hernandez introduced a motion calling on a transportation study to assess existing conditions and identify recommendations for solutions that best serves the surrounding neighborhoods while reducing regional dependency on automobiles to arrive at the stadium.



**Focus Area:** neighborhoods closest to Dodger Stadium, including Solano Canyon, Elysian Valley, Echo Park, Chinatown, Angelino Heights, and Lincoln Heights



**Status:** Community Outreach Engagement

## Study Overview

The City of Los Angeles is conducting a transportation study to identify transportation improvements to increase access to and from Dodger Stadium while reducing impacts on neighboring communities. The study will assess current conditions for all modes of travel, including driving, rideshare, shuttles, transit, biking, and walking, on both event and non-event days.

Community input will be central to the study, with a focus on the neighborhoods most directly affected, including, but not limited to Solano Canyon, Elysian Valley, Echo Park, Chinatown, Angelino Heights, and Lincoln Heights. Findings will inform a series of short- and long-term recommendations grounded in community feedback and current multimodal traffic patterns.

## Related Efforts

The City of Los Angeles is also planning safety and mobility improvements for pedestrians, cyclists, and transit riders along Sunset Blvd and Cesar Chavez Ave. These efforts will help create a safer, more cohesive transportation network for people walking, biking, taking transit, and driving to and from the study area.
